
Then in the fullness of time you sent your Son Jesus,

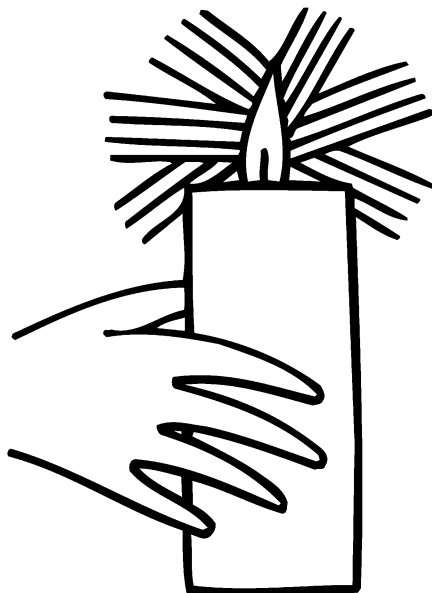
